



JUNIOR RODEO EVENTS AND RULES

Registration begins June 1, 2010

There is no entry fee for the Jr. Rodeo. Admission onto the rodeo grounds will apply.

Pee Wee Barrel Racing

- Age Group: 9 & Under
- Children must provide their own Helmet & Horse
- Contestants will run a barrel pattern
- Pattern must be done at a **SAFE SPEED**
- Parents may lead the horse if needed
- Meet at south end of the arena at 5:15 pm (1:15 pm on July 1st) with horse
- Winner will be based on time and pattern completed correctly

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: 10 PER NIGHT
PRE-REGISTRATION REQUIRED

Junior Barrel Racing

- Age Group: 10-14
- Children must provide their own Helmet & Horse
- Contestants will run a barrel pattern
- Pattern must be done at a **SAFE SPEED**
- Meet at south end of the arena at 5:15 pm (1:15 pm on July 1st) with horse
- Winner will be based on time and pattern completed correctly

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: 10 PER NIGHT
PRE-REGISTRATION REQUIRED

****Horses are not provided for the Barrel Racing events. Contestants must make arrangements for their own horse.****

*****All Horses and Horse Trailers must be parked outside the gate at the south end of the arena *****

Mutton Busting

- Age Group: 5 & 6 (NO EXCEPTIONS)
- Children must provide their own helmet
- Meet at north end of the arena at 5:30 pm (1:30 pm on July 1st)

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: 5 PER NIGHT
PRE-REGISTRATION REQUIRED

Mutton Scramble

- Age Group: 7 & Under
- Meet at north end of the arena at 5:30 pm (1:30 pm on July 1st)
- A horn will sound marking "GO"
- Object is to pull the ribbon off the sheep and run the ribbon back to the designated person in front of the bucking chutes. First person to bring the ribbon back is the Winner

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: Unlimited
PRE-REGISTRATION NOT REQUIRED

Calf Scramble

- Age Group: 8 to 12
- Meet at north end of the arena at 5:30 pm (1:30 pm on July 1st)
- A horn will sound marking "GO"
- Object is to pull the ribbon off the calf and run the ribbon back to the designated person in front of the bucking chutes. First person to bring the ribbon back is the Winner

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: Unlimited
PRE-REGISTRATION NOT REQUIRED



Wild Pony Race

- Age Group: 10 – 13
- 3 person team
- One entry per person and/or team
- Must provide their own helmets
- Meet at the north end of the arena at intermission
- There will be 6 teams competing for the first four nights (June 29, 30, July 1, 2) and the winning team from those nights will move to the finals on July 3, 2010.
- All Youth hold lead shank while chute is opened, then one youth continues to hold the lead shank while another holds the pony's head, while the 3rd youth then jumps on the pony's back and stays on as long as possible

MAXIMUM # OF CONTESTANTS: 6 Teams (of 3) per night

PRE-REGISTRATION REQUIRED

All contestants must sign in at the Volunteer Booth

- **All children must wear long sleeve shirts, pants and closed toe shoes (no sandals or flip flops) to avoid injury**
- **All contestants in every event will be required to have a Parent or Guardian over the age of 18 sign a Waiver. A separate waiver must be signed for each event and/or performance the contestant is entered in.**
- **Proof of age of contestant will be required when signing in (Alberta Health Care Card or Birth Certificate)**
- **All contestants must be signed in by 5:00 pm (1:00 PM July 1st) if not your spot can and will be given to someone else.**
- **Arena Manager reserves the right to disallow a contestant to compete**

Code of Conduct for all Contestants
